TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

SCRIPTURE MESSAGE: Jesus is speaking about future leaders in his Church who prophesy, cast out demons, and accomplish deeds of power in the cause of Christ without stopping to reflect on whether they are obeying Jesus. They may be busy with programs while neglecting people; busy preparing sermons while neglecting prayer, or doing great things in Jesus' name while neglecting Jesus. They have forgotten the fact that doing Father's will is crucial to salvation. Doing Father's will requires from all Christians - leaders and followers. Doing the Father's will also requires us all 1) to let His light in us shine forth so that people may see our good works and give glory to the Father, to keep and teach the commandments, to deal with anger and to resolve conflict, to maintain proper marital relationships, to act in generous and loving ways, to forgive, and to refrain from judgment. Not profession of faith but practice: Sincerity in a Christian can be demonstrated not by what he says but by what he practices. Fine words can never be a substitute for fine deeds. There is a very big difference between paying lip service to something and really living it out. There are many people around who say that they are followers of Jesus but whose lives do little to show they are. Jesus tells us that those who talk the talk without walking the walk will not enter the kingdom of heaven. A Christian should not be like politicians, car dealers or advertising executives whose talk is cheap and whose promises are not to be trusted or taken seriously. There is only one proof of love, and that proof is obedience to God's words. Faith without practice is a contradiction in terms. and love without obedience is impossibility. We may deceive men with our words, but we cannot deceive God who reads our hearts. That is why St. James advises us, "Be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves" (James 1: 22).
