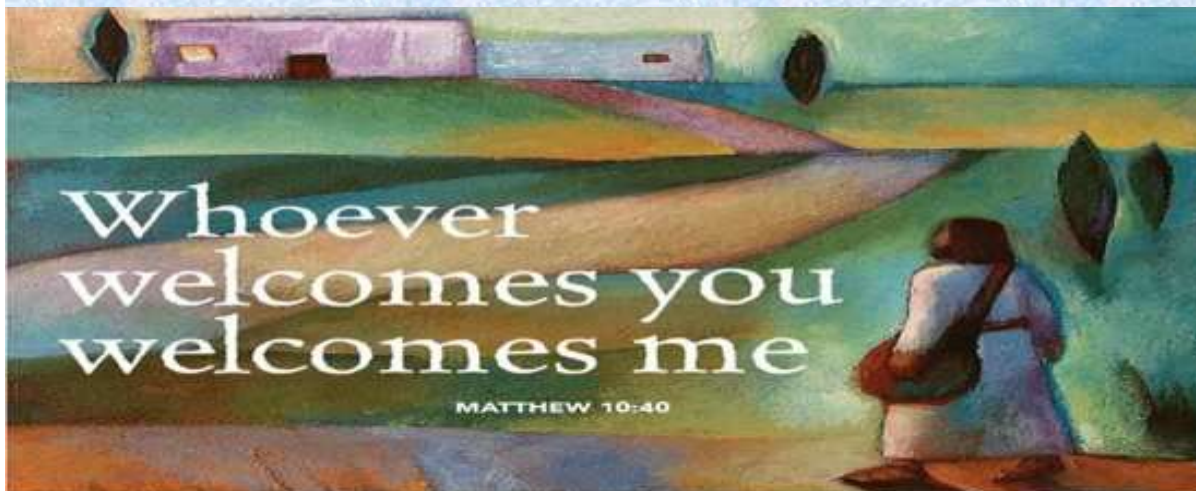

THIRTEENTH AND FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIMES

SCRIPTURE MESSAGE: The common theme of today's readings is the work God gives us to do as the followers of Jesus: to love God and our brothers and sisters through hospitality, generosity, commitment and charity. The readings also remind us of the sacrifice demanded of Jesus' disciples and the suffering they will endure for their Faith when they bear witness to him. **Life message:** Be hospitable and generous: Hospitality means acknowledging the presence of God in others and serving Him, especially in those whom we least expect to find Him. We as a community are to look for the opportunities to be hospitable--and, of course, there are plenty of ways of offering hospitality. Maybe **hospitality is offered through a kind word to a stranger - or even a smile. A kind smile or a "hello" to someone waiting with us in a grocery line may be the only kindness that person encounters all day.** We become fully alive as Christians through the generous giving of ourselves. What is more important than sending checks for charitable causes is giving of ourselves to people -- in the way we speak to them and about them, in the way we forgive their failings, in the way we encourage them, console them and help them, and even in the way we think about them. These types of generosity reflect warmth radiating from the very love of God.

CANADA'S BIRTHDAY: July 1 is celebrated as Canada's birthday. Canadians should seek to be witnesses to Christ in Canada and the world, and to continue working to influence those in government to act from Christian principles and attitudes.



Christians, realizing they do not have a lasting home here, should pray and work for justice and peace in Canada and throughout the world, so that all God's people may share in the goods of the earth. God's Kingdom will come only when all people are ready to let Christ's teaching guide and rule their lives and actions. **"Happy Canada Day"**.

CHANGES: If you are wondering why Mass feels different, St. John Bosco Parish is following the guidelines of the Archdiocese of Kingston. The Ontario Bishops met with many experts and the Ontario government to come up with new guidelines for Mass to reduce the spread of COVID-19. This excerpt is taken from the Archbishop's letter to the Priests and Deacons;

Since it appears that a prolonged contact with others is the prime way the covid-19 virus is spread, I highly recommend that we limit the celebration of the Eucharist to 20 or 30 minutes. For this reason, I authorize the following changes to the celebration of the Sunday Eucharist and Solemnities which are celebrated with the people in Phase Two.

1) The priest may choose only one reading to be read before the Gospel.

2) The Glory to God and the Creed may be omitted.

3) Only a few petitions should be included for the Prayer of the Faithful.

4) The Homily should be concise and to the point (3 or 4 minutes)

5) You may wish to use the Third Penitential Act rather than the "I confess", since it reduces the amount of words spoken by the people.

6) In order to facilitate the orderly existing out of the Church and primarily to avoid logistical problems in giving Communion, while observing safe distancing, I recommend that Communion be distributed after the Blessing and at the exits to the church.

The Archdiocese of Kingston released a twenty page document titled "**Worship Safe**" with directives for all Parishes. This document includes many guidelines and recommendations that St. John Bosco is following. If you have any questions related to Mass or the safety of our Parishioners, please speak to Father Jacob.
